Ndugu msomaji wa jarida hili maalum la TPDC linalolenga kukupa taarifa za utekelezaji wa majukumu kadha wa kadha ya Shirika, mafanikio, changamoto na namna ambayo tunavyoweka jitihada za kutatta changamoto na kuhakikisha taifa linanufaika na uwepo wetu, karibu katika toleo hili uweze kujifunza na kuelewa mengi kuhusu TPDC.

Kwanza kabisa tunayofuraha kukuweka wazi ili uweze kuelewa TPDC ni nini hasa katika uchumi wa nchi.

Sisi kama Shirika lolote la Umma tunawajibu kwa mujibu wa sheria kutekeleza yale majukumu ambayo yapo katika sheria za mashirika ya umma lakini pia sheria ya Mafuta ya mwaka 2015 na jukumu letu kubwa zaidi ni kuhakikisha tunatengeneza faida ili kuwalettea wananchi maendeleo kutokana na kazi zetu lakini kuhakikisha kuwa Serikali inaingiza mapato kupitia shughuli zetu.

Sisi TPDC tunajiona kama mhimili muhimu wa maendeleo ya taifa na hii ni kwasababu kutokana na shughuli zetu za utafutaji wa mafuta na gesi asilia, usafirishaji, usambazaji wa gesi asilia nchini tumekuwa ndio watoaji wakuu wa nishati na chanzo cha nishati ya umeme kupitia gesi asilia nchini.

TPDC toka mwaka 2015 hadi leo tunajivunia kuendelea kuwa kichocheo kikuu cha ukuaji wa uwekezaji wa viwanda vikubwa nchini kupitia upatikanaji wa nishati ya uhakika ya gesi asilia kwa mahitaji ya uendeshaji wa viwanda nchini.

Tunatambua kuwa sekta binafsi na haswa viwanda ndio mwajiri mkuu, mlipa kodi mkuu na vina chochea kwa kiasi kikubwa ukuaji wa sekta nydinge kama madimi, kilimo, ufgaji, afya, elimu na kadhalika. Hivyo sisi TPDC tumejidhatiti kuhakikisha Tanzania inakua na nishati ya uhakika, yakutosha na nafuu kwa wawekezaji kuwekeza nchini.

Pamoja na uwepo na miundombinu ya kuchakata gesi asilia Madimba Mtwara na Songo Songo Lindi pamoja na bomba lenye uwezo mkubwa wa kusafirisha gesi pamoja na ujuzi wa ujenzi wa miundombinu ya kusambaza na kuunganishia wateja, TPDC imejikita kwenye miradi ya uongezaji wa gesi asilia nchini ili kuweza kutosheleza mahitaji ya ndani na nje ya nchi.

Kama anavyooleza Mkurugenzi Mtendaji wa TPDC ndugu Mussa Makame kuwa TPDC kwa sasa kwa kushirikiana na wawekezaji amba ni ARA Petroleum na Ndovu Resources kupitia gesi iliyogunduliwa Ntorya wataongeza kiasi cha gesi asilia futi za ujazo milioni 60 kwa kuanzia na hadi kufikia 140 katika kipindi cha miaka mitatu pamoja na kuweka mitambo ya kuongeza uwezo wa kuzalisha gesi asilia wa visima vya kitalu cha Mnazi Bay ambapo kiasi cha futi za ujazo milioni 20 za gesi asilia kinatarajiwa kuongezwa.

Aidha TPDC na M&P wanatarajiwa kuchimba visima viwili zaidi katika kitalu hicho cha Mnazi Bay ili kulihakikishia taifa gesi ya kutosha hii ni pamoja na kuendelea na utafiti katika maeneo mengine nchini pamoja na kuingia mikataba yenye tija ya uwekezaji katika sekta ya mafuta na gesi nchini.

Akilihakikishia taifa utashi mwema wa Shirika kwenye kuliletea maendeleo taifa Mussa Makame anasema "TPDC ina jukumu kubwa la kulinda maslahi ya Taifa katika sekta na kumiliki hisa katika vitalu vya uendeshaji katika vitalu vya mafuta na gesi kwa hiyo utajji saini kwenye mikataba hii ni hatua kubwa kwa TPDC na ya kihistoria kwa taifa letu kwa kampuni ya Taifa ya Mafuta na Gesi kuweza kununua hisa na kuwa sehemu ya umiliki mkubwa katika kitalu cha Mnazibay".

TPDC pamoja na kuonyesha uwezo wa kitaalam na kifedha wa kununua hisa katika kitalu cha Mnazi Bay kwa kiasi cha shilingi bilioni 60, shirika limeendela na miradi mingine ikiwemo ile ya utafiti wa mafuta katika kitalu cha Eyasi Wembere pamoja na kuunganisha gesi asilia viwanda na watumiaji wa viwandani na kwenye Taasisi.

Tutaendelea kulihakikishia taifa uwepo wa nishati ya kwetu ya uhakika pamoja na kuliletea taifa maendeleo kwa kuendelea na uwekezaji ndani na hata nje ya nchi.

KADHIA YA KUJAZA GESI ASILIA KWENYE MAGARI KUTATULIWA HIVI KARIBUNI

Katibu Mkuu wa Wizara ya Nishati Mhandisi Felichesmi Mramba amewahakikisha watumiaji wa gesi asilia kwenye magari kuwa kadhia waliokuwa wakiipata kutokana na uhaba wa vituo vya kupata huduma hiyo itafikia ukomo hivi karibuni.

Hayo yalisemwa tarehe 20.09.2024 wakati wa ziara fupi ya kukagua maendeleo ya ujenzi wa Kituo Mama cha Kushindilia gesi asilia (CNG Mother Station) kinachojengwa na kumilikiwa na Shirika la Maendeleo ya Petroli Tanzania (TPDC) katika eneo la Chuo Kikuu cha Dar es Salaam pembezoni mwa barabara ya Sam Nujoma.

“Kwa muda mrefu jijini Dar es Salaam tumekuwa na Kituo kimoja cha Ubungo Maziwa kikifuatiwa na kile cha Tazara na cha sasa hivi Kituo cha tatu ni kile cha Uwanja wa Ndege lakini kituo kinachojengwa hapa kitakuwa kikubwa zaidi kuliko vilivyopo kwa sasa kwahiyoo uwepo na kukamilika kwa Kituo hiki mwishoni mwa mwaka basi nile saleni kwenye vituo

vilivyopo sasa hazitokuwepo” ameeleza Mha. Mramba.

“Kwanza naomba nitoe rai kwa watanzania wanavyoona Serikali inafanya uwekezaji mkubwa kama mnavyoona hapa nadhani ni wakati muafaka kwa watu mbalimbali na wenyewe kuwa tayari kubadilisha magari yao ili yaweze kutumia gesi asilia.”

Akielezea huduma zitakazotolewa na Kituo hicho Mha. Mramba alibainisha kuwa Kituo kitakua na eneo la kujaza gesi kwenye magari makubwa ya kusambaza gesi asilia pamoja na vituo vya kuhamishika, kujaza gesi kwenye magari yanayotumia gesi asilia na kutakua na karakana ya kuweka mifumo ya gesi asilia kwenye magari.

Mha. Mramba amewasisitiza Wananchi kuchangamkia fursa hiyo kwasababu imethibitika kitaalam kabisa ya kwamba ukitumia gesi asilia unaokoa zaidi ya 50% ya gharama ya mafuta, kwa mfano kwa mwezi gari yako inatumia shilingi laki mbili basi kwa

kutumia gesi asilia utatumia chini ya shilingi laki moja. Aidha, kwa upande wake Mha. Mwikwabe Mhono kutoka TPDC ameeleza kuwa mradi umegawanyika katika sehemu kuu mbili ambazo ni kazi za ujenzi na kazi za uundwaji wa mitambo ambapo kwa upande wa kazi za ujenzi amebainisha kuwa zilianza mwishoni mwa mwezi wa sita na hadi sasa tayari ukamilifu wake umefikia 57% na kwa upande wa uundwaji wa mitambo ambao unafanyika nchini China tayari umefikia 99%.

Mradi wa ujenzi wa Kituo Mama cha CNG cha TPDC unaenda sambamba na ujenzi wa vituo vidogo vya hospitali ya Muhimbili na Kiwanda cha Madawa cha Kairuki kilichopo Kibaha.

Kukamilika kwa mradi huu kutawezesha ukuaji wa matumizi ya gesi asilia nchini hata kwenye maeneo ambayo hayajafikiwa na bomba la gesi asilia.

Timu ya Shirika la Maendeleo ya Petroli Tanzania (TPDC) imeonyesha mfano wa kuigwa kwa kujumuisha juhudzi za kusaidia wahitaji katika jamii. Timu hiyo, inayojivunia umahiri ndani na nje ya uwanja, imetekeleza mpango wa kuwasaidia watu wenye uhitaji katika Jiji la Tanga wakati wakishiriki mashindano ya SHIMMUTA TANGA 2024. Kitendo hicho cha kuchangia jamii kimeonesha dhamira ya Shirika kuimarisha maendeleo endelevu kwa vitendo.

UCHUKUAJI TAARIFA ZA UTAFITI ENEO LA NCHI KAVU BONDE LA EYASI WEMBERE, WAKAMILIKA

Shirika la Maendeleo ya Petroli Tanzania (TPDC) limekamilisha uchukuaji wa taarifa za utafiti wa mafuta na gesi asilia eneo la nchi kavu katika bonde la Eyasi Wembere lililopo Kaskazini-Mashariki mwa Tanzania kwenye mikoa mitano ya Tabora, Singida, Arusha, Simiyu na Shinyanga ambapo kwa awamu hii, utafiti umegusa mikoa mitatu ambayo ni Singida (Mkalama na Iramba), Simiyu (Meatu) na Arusha (Karatu).

Hayo yalielezwa Novemba, 2024 na Meneja mradi wa utafiti wa mafuta katika Bonde la Eyasi Wembere Mjofizikia Mwandumizi Sindi Maduhu katika kambi ya utafiti wa mafuta iliyopo Kijiji cha Bukundi Wilayani Meatu ambapo alieleza kuwa awamu hii ya utafiti ilianza mwezi Agosti mwaka huu na hadi sasa

maendeleo ni mazuri kwani taarifa za mitetemo za mfumo wa 2D (2D Seismic Survey) zenyet urefu wa kilomita 430 zimekusanya.

Aidha, Sindi alifafanua kuwa, shughuli za utafiti kwa awamu hii zimegusa mikoa 3 ya Singida Arusha na Simiyu na zilikwenda sambamba na zoezi la uthamini ambapo jumla ya vijiji 15 vya mikoa hiyo vyenye idadi ya waathirika wa mradi 541 wako mbioni kulipwa fidia ya mazao yaliyoharibiwa wakati wa zoezi la utafiti.

Katika hatua nyingine, Sindi amewaeleza Wananchi kuendelea na shughuli zao za maendeleo zikiwemo za kiuchumi kama kilimo, uvuvi, ufugaji na shughuli zingine za kijamii kwani kwa awamu hii shughuli za utafiti zimesitishwa kwa muda na zitaendelea eneo

la majini katika Ziwa Eyasi mwezi Mei, 2025.

Pia, Sindi alishukuru na kupongezajuhudi zinazofanywa na Rais wa Jamhuri ya Muungano wa Tanzania Mhe. Dkt. Samia Suluhu Hassan kwa kuendelea kuunga mkono juhudhi za utafiti wa mafuta na gesi asilia nchini ikiwemo Bonde la Eyasi Wembere, aidha ameishukuru Wizara ya Nishati, Bodi ya Wakurugenzi na Menejimenti ya TPDC kwa juhudhi kubwa za usimamizi na maelekezo ambayo wanayatoa ili kuhakikisha shughuli za utafiti zinakamilika kwa tija na kwa wakati.

Aidha, TPDC na Mkandarasi (AGS) wanaendelea na zoezi la kurejesha mazingira ambayo yaliathiriwa na shughuli za mradi kuwa katika hali yake ya awali (restoration).

Shirika la Maendeleo ya Petroli Tanzania (TPDC) limetoa ufanuzi kuhusu changamoto ya upatikanaji wa huduma ya kujaza gesi kwenye magari katika vituo vya kujazia gesi asilia.

Ufanuzi huo umetolewa na Kaimu Mkurugenzi wa Biashara ya Mafuta na Gesi -TPDC Mhandisi Emmanuel Gilbert wakati akifanya mukutano na Waandishi wa Habari tarehe 03.10.2024 Jijini Dar es salaam.

Mha. Gilbert alisema, changamoto ya upatikanaji wa gesi asilia kwenye magari inatokana na mapokeo ya matumizi ya gesi asilia kwenye magari kuongezeka na hivyo

kusababisha changamoto ya upatikanaji wa huduma ya kujaza gesi kwenye vituo vya kujazia gesi.

Akieleza mikakati ya TPDC katika kutatua changamoto ya vituo amesema, Kituo kinachojengwa na TPDC eneo la Chuo Kikuu Dar es salaam ambacho kitakamilika mwezi Desemba, 2024 kitakuwa na pampu nne za kujaza gesi, na kila pampu itakuwa na nozeli mbili hivyo kutakuwa na nozeli nane zenyewe uwezo wa kujaza CNG kwenye magari nane kwa wakati mmoja ambapo kwa siku kitajaza zaidi ya magari 2000 na kitakuwa na uwezo wa kushindilia na kujaza gesi (CNG) kwenye malori matatu (CNG tube trailers) kwa wakati

mmoja sawa na malori 24 kwa siku yatakayosafirisha na kusambaza gesi kwenye maeneo mbalimbali.

Aidha, TPDC kwa kushirikiana na Sekta binafsi ipo katika mkakati wa kukamilisha ujenzi wa vituo 13 vya kujaza gesi asilia kwenye magari ifikapo mwezi Julai, 2025.

Katika hatua nyingine Mha. Gilbert alisema kuwa, Kampuni mbalimbali zinaendelea kujitokeza kujenga vituo vya gesi ikiwemo Kampuni ya Mafuta ya PUMA ambayo itaanza ujenzi wa vituo viwili eneo la Mbezi beach na Tegeta Jijini Dar es salaam.



UJENZI WA MRADI WA EACOP WAFIKIA ASILIMIA 45.5

Mradi wa Bomba la Mafuta Ghafi la Afrika Mashariki (EACOP), unaounganisha bomba la mafuta ghafi kutoka Hoima nchini Uganda hadi Chongoleani, Tanga, umefikia asilimia 45.5 katika hatua ya ujenzi ambapo shughuli za ujenzi zinaendelea katika maeneo mbalimbali kuanzia Mtukula Kagera mpaka Chongoleani Tanga na kwamba mpaka kufikia Oktoba 2024 Serikali kupitia TPDC imechangia mtaji wa takribani Shilingi Bilioni 977.6 kwenda kwenye Kampuni ya Mradi EACOP.

Taarifa hii ilitolewa Oktoba 18, 2024, na Mratibu wa Mradi wa EACOP kutoka Shirika la Maendeleo ya Petroli Tanzania (TPDC), Bw. “Kiwanda hiki kinaendelea na uzalishaji wa mabomba ambapo mpaka sasa jumla ya mabomba yenye urefu wa kilomita 70.7 yamewekwa mifumo ya kupasha na kutunza joto. Ujenzi wa bomba na miundombinu yake unaendelea,” amesema Mrutu.

Mpaka sasa mradi umeleta mafanikio makubwa ikiwemo fursa za ajira 7,584, manunuzi ya huduma na bidhaa za ndani ya nchi zenye thamani ya takribani Shilingi Bilioni 833.7, mapato kwa Serikali takribani Shilingi Bilioni 40, uhaulishaji wa teknolojia toka kwa Wakandarasi,” alieleza

Mrutu.

Alieleza kuwa ujenzi wa Kiwanda cha kuweka mifumo ya kupasha na kutunza joto kwenye mabomba uliopo Kijiji cha Sojo Wilaya ya Nzega Mkoa wa Tabora umefikia asilimia 93 na ulizinduliwa rasmi na Naibu Waziri Mkuu na Waziri wa Nishati Mhe. Dkt. Doto Biteko mnamo Machi 26, 2024.

“Pamoja na kuwa mwanahisa, TPDC inamiliki ardhi ya mkuza wa bomba na maeneo ya ujenzi wa makambi ambapo mpaka sasa tumefanikiwa kulipa fidia jumla ya shilingi Bilioni 35.1 kwa Wananchi 9,858 kati ya 9,927 sawa na 99.3%. Katika hatua nyingine, Mwakilishi wa Mkurugenzi Mtendaji wa TPDC kwenye ziara hiyo, Mkurugenzi wa Mipango na Uwekezaji Bw. Derick Moshi alieleza kuwa mradi wa Eyasi Wembere ni wa kimkakati katika nchi na jukumu la TPDC ni kusimamia shughuli zikamilike kwa wakati.

Naye, Kaimu Meneja wa Utafutaji kutoka TPDC Bw. Simoni Nyalusi alisema kuwa shughuli za utafiti zinazofanyika katika Bonde hilo, zinatekelezwa kwenye maeneo mawili ambayo ni eneo la nchi kavu na eneo la majini ndani ya Ziwa Eyasi.

Mussa Makame, the Executive Director of the Tanzania Petroleum Development Corporation (TPDC), has provided an update on the organization's efforts to increase the country's natural gas production and its role in the oil and gas sector. Currently, TPDC is collaborating with investors, including ARA Petroleum and Ndovu Resources, to significantly boost the natural gas supply from the Ntorya field. Starting with an increase from 60 million cubic feet to 140 million cubic feet within three years, the project will also see the installation of plants designed to enhance production capacity at the Mnazi Bay block wells. In this area, production is expected to rise by an additional 20 million cubic feet.

Additionally, TPDC is working with M&P to drill two new wells in the Mnazi Bay block, which is part of ongoing efforts to ensure the nation has sufficient gas supply. These developments are part of a broader strategy that also includes conducting research in other regions and forging new investment agreements in Tanzania's oil and gas sector.

Makame emphasized TPDC's commitment to the nation, starting that the corporation has a crucial role in safeguarding the country's interests in the sector, as well as holding shares in development blocks and operations. He noted that the recent agreements, including TPDC's purchase of a 60-billion-shillings share in the Mnazi Bay block, represent a significant milestone both for the organization and for the country.

Besides this, TPDC is engaged in other important initiatives such as oil exploration in the Eyasi Wembere block and expanding the natural gas infrastructure to connect industries and institutions. Makame reassured the nation of TPDC's dedication to providing reliable energy and driving economic development, both within Tanzania and internationally.

Natural Gas Filling Station Challenges to Be Resolved Recently

The scarcity of natural gas filling stations for vehicles in Tanzania will soon be a thing of the past, assured Engineer Felichesmi Mramba, Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Energy. Speaking on September 20, 2024, during an inspection of the CNG Mother Station under construction at the University of Dar es Salaam along Sam Nujoma Road, Mr. Mramba announced that the facility is set to be

completed as soon as possible.

"For years, Dar es Salaam has relied on just three filling stations: Ubungo Maziwa, Tazara, and the Airport," Mr. Mramba remarked. "However, this new station will be significantly larger and more advanced. Once operational, it will alleviate the long queues at the existing stations, offering a more convenient and efficient service to vehicle owners."

He urged Tanzanians to embrace the government's efforts and consider converting their vehicles to run on natural gas. "This station is a clear example of the government's commitment to making substantial investments.

Natural gas not only reduces fuel costs by more than 50%, but it is also a cleaner energy alternative," he said. "For



instance, a vehicle owner spending 200,000 shillings monthly on fuel could cut that cost to below 100,000 shillings by switching to natural gas."

Key Features of the CNG Mother Station

The station, owned and developed by the Tanzania Petroleum Development Corporation (TPDC), will be equipped to serve large vehicles transporting natural gas and mobile refueling units for natural gas-powered cars.

It will also include workshops for installing natural gas

systems in vehicles, further promoting the use of this eco-friendly fuel source. TPDC's Mwikwabe Mhono provided additional updates, stating that the project comprises two main phases: construction and equipment assembly.

"Construction began in late June and is now 57 percent complete. Meanwhile, the assembly of key equipment, being done in China, has reached 99 percent," he revealed.

Expanding Natural Gas Access Across Tanzania
In addition to the CNG Mother

Station, smaller filling stations are being developed at Muhimbili Hospital and the Kairuki Pharmaceutical Factory in Kibaha. These projects aim to expand natural gas accessibility, even in regions not yet connected to the natural gas pipeline network.

Once completed, the TPDC CNG Mother Station will mark a significant milestone in Tanzania's efforts to enhance the adoption of natural gas as a cost-effective and sustainable fuel solution, benefiting both the economy and the environment.

COLLECTION OF RESEARCH INFORMATION DRY LAND EYASI WEMBERE VALLEY COMPLETED

The Tanzania Petroleum Development Corporation (TPDC) has completed the collection of information on oil and natural gas research in the Eyasi Wembere valley located in the North-East of Tanzania in the five regions of Tabora, Singida, Arusha, Simiyu and Shinyanga where this phase, the research has touched three regions which are Singida (Mkalama and Iramba), Simiyu (Meatu) and Arusha (Karatu).

This was explained in November, 2024 by the Manager of the oil research project in the Eyasi Wembere Basin, Senior Geophysicist Sindi Madhu at the oil research camp located in Bukundi Village in Meatu District where he explained that this research phase started in August this year and so far the progress is good because seismic information of the 2D

system (2DSeismic Survey) with a length of 430 km has been collected.

In addition, Sindi explained that the research activities for this phase have touched the 3 regions of Singida, Arusha and Simiyu and went along with the valuation exercise where a total of 15 villages in those regions with a number of 541 project victims are in the process of being compensated for the crops damaged when of the research exercise.

In another step, Sindi has told the citizens to continue with their development activities including economic ones such as agriculture, fishing, breeding and other social activities because for this phase the research activities have been temporarily suspended and will continue in the water area in

Lake Eyasi in May, 2025.

Moreover, Sindi thanked and praised the efforts made by the President of the United Republic of Tanzania Hon. Dr. Samia Suluhu Hassan for continuing to support oil and natural gas research efforts in the country including the Eyasi Wembere Basin, she also thanked the Ministry of Energy, the Board of Directors and the Management of TPDC for the great management efforts and instructions they give to ensure that the research activities are completed productively and on time.

In addition, TPDC and the Contractor (AGS) are continuing the exercise of restoring the environment that was affected by the project's activities to its original state (restoration).

TPDC Takes Action to Overcome Challenges in Accessing Natural Gas Filling Stations for Vehicles

Dar es salaam,

The Tanzania Petroleum Development Corporation (TPDC) has provided clarity on the ongoing challenges related to accessing natural gas filling stations for vehicles.

This update was shared by the Acting Director of Oil and Gas Business at TPDC, Engineer Emmanuel Gilbert, during a press briefing on October 3, 2024, in Dar es Salaam.

Engineer Gilbert explained that the increasing use of compressed natural gas (CNG) in vehicles has driven up demand, leading to difficulties in securing refueling services at existing stations.

The surge in CNG adoption has placed additional strain on the current infrastructure,

making it harder for drivers to access gas refueling points.

To tackle these challenges, TPDC is implementing several initiatives. A major development is the construction of a new CNG refueling station at the University of Dar es Salaam, set to be completed by December 2024.

This facility will include four pumps, each with two nozzles, enabling it to serve up to eight vehicles simultaneously. The station is expected to refuel over 2,000 vehicles per day and will also have the capability to fill three CNG tube trailers at once, helping transport and distribute gas to other regions.

Additionally, TPDC is

collaborating with private sector partners to build 13 more CNG stations across the country, with plans to have them operational by July 2025.

Engineer Gilbert also pointed out that several private companies are stepping up to support the expansion of CNG infrastructure. One notable example is PUMA Energy, which is planning to build two new CNG stations in Dar es Salaam, located at Mbezi Beach and Tegeta.

These efforts by TPDC and its partners reflect the government's dedication to expanding clean energy solutions and addressing the growing demand for natural gas in the transportation sector.



EACOP Construction Hits 45.5% Milestone, Driving Socio-Economic Growth

The East African Crude Oil Pipeline (EACOP), stretching from Hoima in Uganda to Chongoleani in Tanga, Tanzania, has achieved 45.5% progress in construction. Work is ongoing across multiple locations, from Mtukula in Kagera to Chongoleani in Tanga.

This milestone was announced on October 18, 2024, by EACOP Project Coordinator from the Tanzania Petroleum Development Corporation (TPDC), Mr. Asiadi Mrutu. He shared the update during a site visit to the heating and insulation factory in Sojo Village, Nzega District, Tabora Region. The visit included members of the National Planning Commission, TPDC Board of Directors, and management.

Mrutu highlighted that the project's advancement reflects President Dr. Samia Suluhu Hassan's dedication to fostering major infrastructure development. By October 2024, the Tanzanian government, through TPDC, had invested 977.6 billion Tanzanian Shillings into the EACOP Project Company.

"The factory continues producing insulated pipes, and 70.7 kilometers of pipes have already been equipped with heating and insulation systems. The construction of the pipeline and its infrastructure is progressing well," Mrutu reported.

Key accomplishments of the project include the creation of 7,584 jobs, procurement of local goods and services worth 833.7 billion Tanzanian Shillings, and government revenue of 40 billion Tanzanian Shillings. Additionally, contractors have facilitated significant technology transfer to local stakeholders.

The factory in Sojo Village, a critical component of the pipeline construction, is now 93% complete. Officially inaugurated on March 26, 2024, by Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Energy, Hon. Dr. Doto Biteko, the factory has been pivotal in producing and processing pipeline materials.

As a major shareholder, TPDC has ensured smooth land acquisition for the pipeline

corridor. Compensation totaling 35.1 billion Tanzanian Shillings has been paid to 9,858 out of 9,927 affected residents, achieving a 99.3% payout rate. Furthermore, 340 replacement homes have been constructed for 294 displaced individuals.

"The government is working closely with other shareholders to ensure timely funding and smooth implementation of the project. We anticipate the construction will be completed by mid-2026," Mrutu assured.

The EACOP project serves as a transformative infrastructure initiative, creating employment, enhancing local investment, and stimulating economic growth. Its completion is set to benefit Tanzania, Uganda, and the region at large.





TPDC's Eyasi Wembere Oil and Gas Exploration Project Reaches 40% Completion

The Tanzania Petroleum Development Corporation (TPDC) has announced significant progress in its oil and gas exploration efforts in the Eyasi Wembere Basin, which spans the regions of Simiyu, Singida, Arusha, Tabora, and Shinyanga. The project, now 40% complete, is a government-funded initiative with an investment of 43 billion Tanzanian Shillings.

During a recent site visit, members of the TPDC Board of Directors expressed satisfaction with the project's advancement and commended the corporation for its dedication. Ambassador Kalaghe, a Board member,

highlighted the excellent management of the exploration activities, noting, "We have witnessed commendable progress in the exploration of oil and natural gas. We appreciate the TPDC management and extend gratitude to the Ministry of Energy, under the leadership of Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Energy Hon. Dr. Doto Biteko, for their unwavering support."

The Eyasi Wembere Basin project, initiated in 2015, is a critical part of Tanzania's efforts to expand its energy resources. TPDC's Director of Planning and Investments, Mr. Derick Moshi, emphasized the

project's strategic significance, stating, "This exploration is vital for the nation, and TPDC is committed to ensuring timely completion."

The ongoing activities include seismic data collection and analysis to confirm the presence of oil or natural gas. Acting Exploration Manager, Mr. Simoni Nyalusi, explained that the exploration is being conducted in two areas: the onshore region and the offshore area within Lake Eyasi. He revealed that promising indicators of oil and gas deposits have emerged in the onshore region, fueling optimism for successful outcomes.

Local residents in villages impacted by the exploration activities have already begun experiencing benefits. Employment opportunities in areas such as security, electrical work, driving, and construction have created economic upliftment for many.

Njibu Tinha, a resident of Nyahaa Village in the Mkalama District, shared his perspective: "This project is a blessing for us. Many young people have found jobs, and we are committed to supporting the professionals to ensure smooth operations."

With exploration in the Eyasi Wembere Basin advancing steadily, the project has raised hopes for significant energy discoveries that could transform Tanzania's energy landscape while continuing to deliver socio-economic benefits to local communities.
